2019 - 2020 | When ESG Disclosure Finally Gets Regulated: Financial Impacts of the French Energy Transition Law

Supervised by: Prof. Dr. Remi Bazillier, Panthéon Sorbonne & Prof. Dr. Jean-Bernard Chatelain, PSE

Using data for 96 firms in the CAC40 and Euronext100 markets, I conduct an event study following the announcement of the French Energy Transition Law in 2014. In a second part, I observe the effect of the law on the importance of ESG disclosure for firm's financial performance since 2015.

2019 - 2020 | Climate Change & The Just Transition : Assessing Environmental, Social, Governance Impacts of the Transition to a Low Carbon Economy

Supervised by: Elise Attal & Prof. Laetitia Duval, Panthéon Sorbonne

In partnership with Vigeo Eiris and The Master of Sustainable Development, I was part of a team who conducted qualitative study regarding the just transition. For this, we conducted interviews of different stakeholders in the USA and France, analyzed results, reviewed literature and created a roadmap for investors to engage in the just transition based on best practices.

2018 - 2019 | Determinants of Renewable Electricity Generation: The Role of Control of Corruption in The Transition & The Failure of Kyoto

Supervised by: Prof. Dr. Carmen Camacho Perez, PSE

Using a panel dataset for countries who adopted the Kyoto Protocol, I study the causal link between level of corruption and level of renewable electricity output. Results showed an overall negative effect of corruption on electricity output. Surprisingly, developed countries did not outperform developing countries. Overall, this study highlights the failure of Kyoto to curb emissions and begin a transition towards renewable energy.

2014 - 2015 | The Effect of News Exposure on Immigration Perspectives

Supervised by: Prof. Joyce Clapp, UNCG

Based on the US GSS Sociological Survey, I study the way in which exposure to biased news channels influences the level of racism of Americans against Latin American immigrants. Additionally, using Qualtrics, I conducted my own small survey. Results showed a strong positive correlation between right wing news channels and racism towards latin immigrants.
