Food well-being at the time of Covid-19: The use of coping strategies rooted in caring for low socio-economic status families

Covid-19 lockdown in spring 2020 upset families' lives, reorganising their daily activities and restricting living space: dining out decreased, families learned to cohabit and parents took over school via distance education. This pandemic disrupted the way consumers ate, shopped and interacted with food (Janssen et al. 2021; Scott and Martin 2021). Yet, the effects of Covid-19 on food consumption and food well-being (FWB) differed depending on consumers' socio-economic situations (Hamilton 2021; Scott and Martin 2021). It became apparent that, during lockdown, families' FWB required material comfort and financial ease due in part to food price increases causing adverse effects on low socio-economic status (SES) families' FWB. Rooted in the TCR stream (Mick 2006; Mick et al. 2012), this research aims to deepen our understanding of families' FWB in a state of vulnerability by analysing the strategies they deployed in spring 2020 to face this unprecedented situation.
